Proposal for Chickasha High School
Athletic Hall of Fame
August 14, 2006

The purpose of Chickasha High School Athletic Hall of Fame is to recognize players and coaches that have excelled in the area of interscholastic sports. Upon approval of this recognition program by the board of education I, as Superintendent of Schools, will initiate the Athletic Hall of Fame with the following three honorary members:

- Harley Day – Chickasha High School Boys Basketball Coach; State Champion in 1953 & 1955
- Jerry Jobe – Chickasha High School Boys Basketball Coach; State Champion in 1963. Player on 1955 Boys Basketball State Championship Team
- Jay Sherry – Chickasha High School Girls Basketball Coach; State Champion in 1984

To be eligible for Chickasha High School Athletic Hall of Fame you must meet the following criteria:

- A player must have lettered in the sport being recognized.
- Players must have graduated from Chickasha High School a minimum of five years before they become eligible for the Hall of Fame.
- Coaches must have coached at Chickasha High School a minimum of four years to be eligible.
- Coaches must wait five years after the completion of their employment with Chickasha Schools before they are eligible for the Hall of Fame.

The Athletic Department will take applications every summer for new members in the Chickasha High School Athletic Hall of Fame. Applications must contain a written summary of their accomplishments while attending Chickasha High School in the area of interscholastic sports. A 3" x 5" picture must accompany the application. A committee will review applicants and select no more than two applicants per year for induction into the Athletic Hall of Fame. Inductees will be honored during a home basketball game.
